

## **Volunteering Opportunities**

### **Afternoon Volunteer Cook – Monday to Friday – Henrietta Street**

This is an opportunity for you to prepare, cook and serve evening meals to residents at Julian House's supported housing project in Henrietta Street, which provides accommodation for 9 residents with Autism spectrum conditions, including Asperger's.

You will be working in the residents' communal kitchen, (the volunteering session is 4.00pm to 6.00pm).

#### **Skills and Qualifications Required**

Due to the nature of the role, we ask that volunteers have very good interpersonal skills and are prepared to make a regular commitment.

In addition to this you will need to be able to cook, non-judgmental and able to empathise with the residents.

#### **Skill Development**

This role will provide opportunities for you to develop your cooking, communication and interpersonal skills. General Health and Safety and project specific induction will be provided. A wider programme of training is being developed.

#### **Directions**

Henrietta Street is in Bath, a 5 minute walk from Pultney Bridge. It leads off Laura Place, a quadrangle with a fountain in the centre, which is at the opposite end of Pultney Street to the Holborne Museum.

#### **Other Information**

Volunteers must be at least 18 years old.

Volunteers will receive support from the Henrietta Street Staff and the Julian House Volunteer Coordinator.

Volunteers should be prepared to commit to at least 2 sessions per month and we would prefer this commitment to continue for at least 6 months.

Fair and reasonable travel expenses incurred in carrying out volunteering sessions will be paid by Julian House.

In doing this you will be a key member of the Henrietta Street team, who value the contribution that our volunteers make and actively support them in this role.
