Volunteer Cycle Ranger

Introduction

As a volunteer cycle ranger with Aspire you will be helping look after the traffic-free paths in the Bristol area.

Aspire is a social enterprise project run by the charity Julian House. As well as providing professional path and garden maintenance services, window cleaning, and painting & decorating services, Aspire also supports people to gain skills, qualifications and work experience.

Summary of the Role

As a volunteer cycle ranger you will:

- Undertake checks on a section of cycle path at least once a month
- Report any obstructions or major issues with the cycle path
- Carry out litter-picking and clear back encroaching vegetation
- Keep a record of your activities and report back to us on a regular basis

Skills and Qualifications Required

Volunteers wishing to apply for this role must be practical, able to carry out tasks independently and have good communication skills.

Training and Support

Full training will be provided and there will be regular communication with you to support you in your role. There will also be the opportunity to develop your skills and potentially experience other roles within Aspire or our other social enterprises such as the Julian House bike workshop. There could also be the opportunity to gain paid work with Aspire, subject to availability, skills and experience.

Other Information

Volunteers must be at least 18 years old.

Volunteers will receive support from staff employed by Aspire. Reasonable travel expenses will be reimbursed.

Volunteers should be prepared to commit to at least 3 hours per month. We would prefer this commitment to continue for a minimum of 3 months.

In doing this job you will have a key role within our organisation as we rely on the support of our volunteers.
